**Article 1** 

The Legislative Branch is also called Congress. It is made up of two houses:

### The Senate and the House of Representatives

The Enumerated<sup>1</sup> Powers of Congress are listed in Article 1, Section 8 of the Constitution.

#### Congress has the power to:

- 1. Make laws
- 2. Lay and collect taxes
- 3. Coin and Borrow money
- 4. Impeach and remove the President
- 5. Declare war
- 6. Pay debts and provide for defense
- 7. Establish post offices
- 8. Raise and support armies
- 9. Provide and maintain a Navy
- 10.Regulate commerce
- 11.Establish uniform naturalization

#### The House of Representatives

States with the largest populations have the most representatives in the House.



Representatives must be at least 25 years old to serve.

Representatives must be a citizen for at least 7 years.

Representatives must live in the state and district they are representing.

Representatives are elected to a two-year term.

There are 435 members in the House of Representatives.
