The **Senate** is the other part of **Congress**.

There are **two** senators for **each state**, which means there are **100** Senators.

Senators must be at least **30** years old.

Senators must be a **citizen** for at least **9** years.

Senators must **live** in the **state** they are representing.

Senators are **elected** to a **six** year term.

The Executive Branch Article 2

The **Executive** branch is also called the **President**.
The **Enumerated Powers** of the President are:

- **Take care that the laws be faithfully executed**
- **Recommend Legislation**
- **Commander in Chief of the Armed Forces**
- **Grant reprieves and pardons**
- **Make treaties**
- **Nominate and Appoint Ambassadors and Supreme Court Justices**
- **Give Congress information on the State of the Union**
- **Receive Ambassadors and other Public Ministers**



What powers did the Constitution give the President?

Obj: (Standard 8.2.6 and WH 8.4) Enumerate the Powers and Requirements of the President. **The President**

The President is **elected** to a **four-year** term.

The President can **only serve two terms** (8 years).

The President must be a **citizen by birth**.

The President must be at least **35** years old.

The President must have **lived** in the United States at least **14** years.

Why does the Constitution require the President to be a citizen by birth?

The President today is **Barack Obama**
The Vice-President today is Joe Biden.



The President-Elect is Donald Trump
The Vice-President - Elect is Mike Pence.



The vice-president becomes president if the president is killed, incapacitated (unable to do his job) or removed from office.
