## **Concept - Migration**

Migration is a common activity that involves the movement or individuals from one place to another that can be seen in a number of animal groups. Even though most of us think of a flock of birds when we hear migration, it is important to note that humans have not excluded themselves from this fundamental phenomenon and continue to migrate to this day.

The migration, or movement, of human beings can in some cases be classified into two more specific subcategories: immigration and emigration.

Thousands of people each year make the decision to emigrate (to leave one's nation) in order to immigrate (to enter and establish oneself) to another nation.
