

Confederation - an organization that consists of a number of parties or groups united in an alliance.

- After England started to impose laws and taxes on the colonists they decided to declare their independence from England.
- In the Declaration of Independence, the colonists stated their beliefs (philosophies) of government. They used many of John Locke's ideas about government.
 - People have natural rights like "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness".
 - The purpose of government is to protect people's natural rights.
- This led to the American Revolution. But it also led the colonists to create a government and constitution to rule the newly "United" States.
- Many people feared having a strong central government and wanted the states to maintain most of the power in the new country.
- The results of their efforts was called the "Articles of Confederation".






